Alleluia!

It can lift you up, never let you down Take your world and turn it all around Ever since time nothing's ever been found That's stronger than love.

These words are from the song A Thing Called Love by Johnny Cash. Of course, Cash was talking about romantic love, but the sentiments can equally be applied to the love of God, in fact even more so. In theological language, this heavenly love is called agape. It denotes the highest form of love, a love that is sacrificial and transcendent. By its nature, it is self-giving, an outpouring for others. It is the centre from which all else flows, as the second reading reminds us. Agape itself is a Greek word, originally used as an expression of love for the dead, and then it's variant in Hebrew evolved to express love for

another. In scripture, the word crops up in may places, most noticeably, perhaps, in the Sermon on the Mount, and in the Gospel of John, which we listen to as our Gospel this Sunday. It is important to reflect on how Jesus, in this context, does not demand we simply love God or Jesus, just because we feel we owe them something for that love. Rather, the command is that we love one another just as we have been loved. No pressure there then! We all know how hard it can to be to love another at the best of times. On a human level, if love can lift us up, it can also dash us against a wall, throw us to the lions, or pit us against the waves. The strange thing is, though, that when we try to love others, a transformation takes place, and this is the clearest evidence of agape we can have this side of the grave. We transform ourselves by love, a love that does not see others as simply objects for our desires, our wants, our needs. We love them, because they, like us have come into existence by the breath of love of God. As we begin to prepare for Pentecost, we begin to reflect more on that breath and its power. The first reading tells us the amazing things that can happen when the Holy Spirit comes down on those who invoke and receive him. As Gerard Manley Hopkins wrote:

And for all this, nature is never spent;

There lives the dearest freshness deep down things; And though the last lights off the black West went Oh, morning, at the brown brink eastward, springs —

Because the Holy Ghost over the bent

World broods with warm breast and with ah! bright wings.

Johnny Cash to Gerard Manley Hopkins, that's quite a jump, but the Holy Spirit moves in all kinds of people in all kinds of ways!
