www.saintsofsussex.com/church-and-hallavailability I am writing this from Walsingham, where I am about to begin the second full day of the National Clergy Retreat. On the first day, I offered Mass for all your intentions. Yesterday, too, we were given a guided tour of the abbey grounds, containing the ruins of the medieval Priory of Our Lady of Walsingham, the Holy Wells, and the site of the Holy House, which was the seedbed for the place of pilgrimage and the reason Walsingham became known as England's Nazareth. What's fascinating is that the dimensions of the purported Holy House of Nazareth, transported to Loreto, are said to match exactly in their essence the dimensions of the house excavated in Walsingham, dimensions given to Richeldis de Faverches in her vision in 1061. Standing on the site, I could almost hear the countless pilgrims' footsteps, the friars' chanting, and the tears at the shrine's destruction in 1538. What is heartening is that today, with both the Anglican and Catholic shrines, Walsingham is a beacon for ecumenism. I posit that, in so doing, it is helping to heal the wounds of history and the tragedy of Christian disunity. At the very least, we can celebrate what unites us instead of festering resentment over what divides us. As a symbol of this, the Anglican shrine contains a replica of the Holy House.

Celebrating what unites us is a good phrase to meditate on as we mark Laetare Sunday, a traditional day of rejoicing, a marker that we are more than halfway through Lent. It's good to take a breather on the pilgrim path before we take up our staff and continue on the journey. It's time to reassess and reevaluate how the journey has been so far and what we need to do to push for the finishing line of Holy Week and the joy of Easter. The Holy House of Nazareth is predicated on a beating heart, the heart of a mother, Mary. Today is also Mothering Sunday or Mother's Day, and we give thanks for the beautiful gift of our mothers, those still with us, and those gone before us marked with the sign of faith. Of course, I am also conscious that, as with Father's Day, some people have had a complicated relationship with their parents. We pray for healing there, too. In Mary of Nazareth, you have a mother who will never abandon or disown you. As Wordsworth wrote, 'Our tainted nature's solitary boast.' Happy Laetare Sunday and Happy Mother's Day.
